

**IASAS Meeting Minutes Via Skype**  
**June 14/15, 2010**

Attendance: Roger Ludeman (Chair), Damian Medina, Annie Andrews and Lisa Bardill Moscaritolo

Response from Denny Roberts/Cynthia Howman regarding possible IASAS affiliation with Qatar and/or Qatar Foundation – Roger had asked if there was a possibility of such affiliations (IASAS is seeking a home for its nonprofit/tax exempt status). Roberts and Howman indicated that such an affiliation would be difficult. Suggested possibly becoming a “global division” of ACPA//NASPA if they eventually merge. The discussion was aimed more at the difficulty in getting a national home base for an international organization (required of tax exempt status. Possibilities: discuss various issues with ACPA and NASPA and how IASAS can assist with global matters; also, take a step back to look at the various reasons for hesitation on the part of several countries to host IASAS as required by law. Funding is an issue as well. Finally, a possibility would be to continue as a virtual organization, build membership by providing better service, etc.

Whatever the direction IASAS takes, it will require a more improved website, more complete and accurate links to national information, and a better facility to conduct blogs and other discussions whether it be Google Groups or another utility. That must be accompanied with additional volunteer efforts since there is no funding base. Damian will work with those who have volunteered so far to help to make the web site better and will have more to report when we meet again in July.

Lisa and Damian will get together before the next meeting to discuss possible software to help us share ideas and best practices.

Roger shared a document he created that summarizes the status of national, international, and world associations and what they offer that makes them viable to meet the needs of its respective members. IASAS, the only worldwide organization in student affairs, is attempting to find its place among these groups. One model is that of the International Leadership Association (ILA) who has been around for over a decade and still working diligently to organize and serve a worldwide clientele. Roger provided us with a copy of ILA’s strategic plan and asked that we review it. He has contacted the ILA leadership but hasn’t heard back.

IASAS is still evolving. Roger called on us to be engaged and follow up further. While we are a volunteer organization, we still have responsibility to serve our constituents.

Our next meeting will be on July 22 at 5 pm for Lisa and 2 pm for Roger and July 23 at midnight for Damian and 6:30 am for Annie.
